1) BRIEF HISTORY OF RESCUE AND SUPPORT THE HELPLESS FOUNDATION (RESH)

The Rescue and Support the Helpless Foundation (RESH) is a non-governmental human development organization domiciled in Nigeria and dedicated to improving lives in a transformative way by advancing integrated, locally driven solutions to the contemporary problems across Nigeria especially to the less privileged abound in the most rural, urban and peri-urban hard to reach communities. It's an NGO that was initially established (incorporated) in 2010 through self help effort under the tutelage of the Omega Power Ministries (OPM) as a Foundation to alleviate the sufferings of the poor and less privileged. The foundation has expanded over the year and through its life saving, humanitarian, peace and development efforts benefitted persons from across all part of the country irrespective of their race, gender, tribe, religion, status etc. However, with the aspiration to deploy a wider scope of operations and leverage the Government's, private sector and other donor commitments across the world, the NGO was recently renamed as Rescue and Support the Helpless Foundation (RESH) in 2025 with headquarters still operational in Port Harcourt City and Abuja.

The organization is founded by Apostle Chibuzo Chinyere Gift who has worked with so many humanitarian, peace and development organizations and actors at national and international levels and has inspired innovation to support vulnerable communities with emphasis on youth, and women through self-help but participatory and community led approach. He currently serves as the Executive Director and chairs its board of directors, which comprises eminent personalities of various professions, and philanthropies who believe in assisting the less privileged but also looking at overall national development agenda of Nigeria. Diversified team of experts in several specialties are part of the staffing arrangements who are always motivated to provide a special combination of skills leadership to assume and implement the interconnected humanitarian, peace, and development issues of today across the country especially with the emerging complex dynamics of the current conflicts across Nigeria .

By offering very important lifesaving, humanitarian, peace and development services to citizens and the most vulnerable populations, the organization educates the public through peacebuilding, social cohesion, livelihood, health, education, and other assistance initiatives. In the community development agenda, livelihood, health and education are essential components of the comprehensive approach. By providing livelihood skills, education and health care, the organization is consciously

safeguarding, preparing, and developing the leaders of tomorrow who will change the lives of people and their families including directly or indirectly contributing to communities and national development. As a result, there is a break the cycle of poverty by increasing the ability to obtain employment or additional training.

Through the establishment of additional live saving, humanitarian, peace and development programs, such as those pertaining to health improvement, women's economic empowerment, education, conflict resolution, water and sanitation, food security and livelihood, and sustainable environmental initiatives across the Country, RESH hopes to support human development holistically. The organization currently provides economic and good governance, advocacy and sensitization, human rights and child protection, and educational assistance programs through self-help and voluntary donations. Though, conversations are ongoing with some well-established donor groups, NGOs, UN agencies, the private sectors for possible collaboration

To guarantee efficient coordination, accountability, and transparency in the administration of programmes, financial resources and assets, as well as the wise use of funds and sustainability, RESH owes its partners the duty to monitor, evaluate, learn, and report appropriately at every level of engagement with the partners and other extended stakeholders.

PEACE BUILDING AND CONFLICT MANAGEMENT

The program improves community resilience to conflicts and other disasters, fortifies integration, and solidifies peaceful coexistence among local communities through training, consultations, provision of early warning and conflict prevention platforms and procedures, conflict management, and post-conflict resilience and recovery supports, it focuses on multilevel coordination of actions.

STRENGTHEN HUMANITARIAN PREPAREDNESS FOR RAPID CRISIS RESPONSE.

The initiative lessens the risks and effects on communities of emergencies caused by both natural and human resources. In addition to increasing the resilience of impacted populations, including internally displaced people and other vulnerable groups, it encourages disaster preparedness and gives community structures the ability to handle and convert complicated events.

ENHANCE INSTITUTIONAL CAPACITY AND PARTNERSHIPS FOR SCALABLE IMPACT

The governance program enhances how governments provide services and generally defend citizens' rights and dignity. Social accountability mechanisms, democratic principles, the rule of law, election procedures, budgetary procedures, policymaking, and legislation are all strengthened by it. This program's primary tactics include technical assistance, capacity building, advocacy, and mobilization.

ADVANCE GENDER RIGHTS AND PROTECTION AND PREVENT GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE (GBV).

Promoting and defending human dignity and fundamental rights is the focus of this program area. With a preference for SGBV, child protection, extrajudicial executions, mass atrocities, war crimes, crimes against humanity, torture, and humiliating treatment, it takes a rights-based approach to lower the opportunity costs of rights violations. The constitution, (international) laws, and human rights conventions are examples of programming tools.

PROMOTE SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS FOR YOUTH AND WOMEN.

This programme empowers the youth and women for innovation, self-reliance and development. It identifies and develops youth and women potential in different sectors and creates windows of opportunities for sustainable development in the short, medium and long terms.

PEACEBUILDING AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

The peacebuilding and environmental protection programme of the foundation complements and strengthens local community values, promotes social cohesion, and a sense of security amongst vulnerable populations while alleviating poverty through community-based initiatives.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

The women development programme improves the quality of life and rights situation of women through equity-based interventions that facilitate development of women on equal basis with men.

EXPAND ACCESS TO FREE, QUALITY HEALTHCARE THROUGH COMMUNITY-BASED HEALTH FACILITIES.

The free and quality health programme improves the quality of life of poor citizens by promoting access to education. It also aims to reduce incidence of school dropout, and child trafficking related youth unemployment, drug abuse and incidences of crime and juvenile delinquencies while empowering community women and youths to utilize local resources and capacity for wealth creation.

PROVIDE INCLUSIVE EDUCATION FOR MARGINALIZED CHILDREN AND YOUTH.

Through scholarships both inside and outside of Nigeria, this initiative aims to give access to basic and postsecondary education. It want to assist in lowering the prevalence and costs of poverty among marginalized groups, especially women and young people living in isolated rural areas.


